
Topographic Diversity across Kutch

Kutch is celebrated for its extraordinary biodiversity, where landscapes shift dramatically from shimmering salt marshes and arid deserts to thriving grasslands, seasonal wetlands, and the vast Arabian coastline. Each of these ecosystems harbours a remarkable variety of life uniquely adapted to extremes.

Some interesting facts:

- Guneri Inland Mangrove is the only place in India where mangroves grow inland, away from the sea. The Grey Hypocolius bird is found predominantly in Kutch, with only a handful of records reported from outside the region.

Did you know?

The Rann floods for about a month each year and is dotted with 74 elevated plateaus called 'bets'. The largest, Pung Bet, spans 30.5 km².
